Dear Rising First Grade Family,

We are looking forward to a fantastic year together! Our goal is that all our students learn and grow as readers, writers, mathematicians, scientists, and social scientists. To get the most out of their first grade year, it is essential that our students come to school ready to learn. Students should be confident in the following skills on their first day of first grade:

ELA • Read and write Kindergarten and First Grade High-Frequency Words correctly. See attached list- <https://sightwords.com/sight-words/dolch/#lists>

- Read daily for 20 minutes • Write a sentence using correct capitalization, punctuation, and spacing. Phonemic spelling for unknown words is appropriate for rising first graders.

- Write using D'Nealian Manuscript.

Math • Create number bonds to ten (see link below.) • Count by 1's, 5's, and 10's, to 120. Count by 2's to 60.1
